

## **Volunteers manage to increase rabbits population to preserve the imperial eagle**

LOCATION: Andújar (Jaén)

DURATION: 1:24

**SUMMARY:** A group of Andalusian volunteers meets every year in Andújar's Sierra to take care of the Iberian imperial eagle. They prepare the mount so rabbits can reproduce easily and these birds in danger of extinction don't suffer from lack of food. The recovery of this mammal is crucial for the survival of this species as it constitutes an 80% in their diet. The work of these volunteers has made possible that in just two years the number of rabbits in this area has been multiplied by three.

### **VTR:**

Recording these images is not easy. The Iberian imperial eagle is the most threatened bird of prey in Europe, and despite efforts, it keeps in danger of extinction. But the key to recover this species may be in other animal, the rabbit.

This is the 'Taking Flight' initiative, coordinated each year by the Seo Birdlife organization. Their volunteers weed or construct shelters for rabbits...to maintain the data of the last decade, optimistic numbers that indicate that the population of Iberian imperial eagle has risen an 8%.
