

## Andalusian engineers create an app to consult a doctor at home

LOCATION: Sevilla

**SUMMARY:** Now it is possible to avoid queuing at the doctor's. We can measure our heart rate, blood pressure, weight and temperature at home and send it to our doctor. He will receive the data and the patient wouldn't have to leave his home or lose time. This is more than an app, it is a system that uses a tablet and measuring devices connected through Bluetooth. For the moment, it is only used in private clinics in Seville and their creators are trying to commercialize it in pharmacies.

Aged sixty two, Loli has severe hypertension and she need to visit a doctor at least once a week. It takes her all morning and some euros to get to the health center. That's why she prefers to perform some tests at home.

With this tablet, that is conected through bluetooth to diferente devices, she can mesure her blood preasure, blood oxygen or heart rate. This app is an initiative of these entrepreneurs and it is one of the Minerva Projects supported by the Governement of Andalusia and Vodafone.

*"Tablets are a tangible reality, we have taken this technology to the sanitary field. Through wireless sensors as the blood pressure monitor, the electrocardiogram monitor or the spirometer we can collect all this data in a very simple way."*

And the doctor receives the test results this way...a small alert and that's it. If he detects any risk for health he will alert the patient immediatly.
