



Microcredit for women , a solidary alternative to banks promoted by the Ana Bella Foundation

LOCATION: Mairena del Aljarafe (Seville)

VTR: 1'25"

SUMMARY: The Ana Bella Foundation has promoted the establishment of a Self-financed Community (CAF) to facilitate access to micro-credit to women at risk of social exclusion with help too from the volunteers in the organization program. Three months ago, in Mairena del Alcor (Seville), seven of these women and a volunteer constituted a voluntary CAF, promoting savings and access to small loans among the women on the program. The foundation members regularly contribute with small amounts of money, these contributions then become the fund available to access these micro-credits which on average range 350 euro and aim to cover everyday expenses such as home repairs , buying appliances, payment of tuition fees... or any matters of urgency. The loans can be repaid in periods of three to six months with a 1% interest rate. At the end of the year the benefits raised by the interests are equally divided among all members of the community. The alternative for those with difficulties to access bank credit has even has echoed in French newspaper Le Monde.

They meet once a month, they pay a voluntary fee and by the end of the year they equally share the profits generated by the interests earned.

Gloria gets 50 euros to replace her broken microwave. She will return the money within three months with a 1% interest rate for those who lent her the money.
