SUMMARY: A group of journalists has join under the project 'Journalists Needed' as a way to fight crisis in the journalism sector. This project is focused in the foundation of a cooperative to create a radio and a newspaper on the Internet. They would put their resources in common to start this journalistic enterprise. 300 associates are necessary to give viability to this project and 27 have already joined.
