SUMMARY: This doctor and writer from Seville, Francisco Gallardo, has used his novel 'The Last Night' to tell the story of one of the first women that practiced medicine in Al-Andalus in the twelfth century, Sara Avenzoar. She was the grand-daughter of the prestigious physician Avenzoar and defied the conventions of that time practising medicine. With this novel, which was written after thirty years of research, Gallardo won the Historical Novel Ateneo Prize.
