**SUMMARY:** A team of entrepreneurs from Seville has created Sevilla Flash, an app for mobile phones that allows the user to become familiar with how Seville looked in past centuries through virtual reconstructions. It is devised for tourists and locals with an interest in the history of their city. As easy as walking through the city, one can enter the app and select the video that corresponds to a particular place in order to see what the constructions of the past looked like.

What you're seeing is Seville's famous Tower of Gold in the present and all its surroundings. But if we travel to the past...that is how the space looked during the 18<sup>th</sup> century. Then the tower served as a place to guard the port. These entrepreneurs have developed an app that allows the user to become familiar with how Seville appeared in other times through virtual reconstructions.

Its creators have already reconstructed 50 of the city's historic spaces. It has been 8 months of technical work and historic documentation. It reveals, for example, the appearance of the mosque during the 12<sup>th</sup> century, presided over by the Giralda, its minaret.
