

An illustrated journey to discover what was living in the Alhambra like

SUMMARY: An illustrated book and a workshop that encourage children to travel back in time and discover what was living in the Alhambra like when it was full of activity. They can walk around its walls and rooms to get to know people who lived there. Illustrator Ana Campos makes it possible with her book 'Así era la vida en la Alhambra' or ('How life was like in the Alhambra') and the workshops that she organises within this monument.

Do you imagine what visiting the Alhambra in the Middle Age would be like? Being able to walk around its walls, getting to know the people who lived there or entering the private rooms of sultans? We can discover with the book created by Granadian illustrator Ana Campo. Just like these children, who have attended this workshop in the Alhambra.

In this workshop, Ana tells children how life was like in a Nasrid palace. And with the help of the book and its windows, they discover information that captures their attention.

"This workshop is focused on how life was like in a Nasrid palace. To explain a small part of that world in a more amusing way, because giving them a lot of information during a visit can be tedious for them. However, they can open the windows of the book and discover the Medina or how fields were plowed."

After discovering all that information and taking a deep look at the pages of 'How life was like in the Alhambra', these children become illustrators and create their own palace, including windows that show their inside.
