

## Integration after overcoming childhood cancer with the help of an association

**LOCATION:** Seville

**DURATION:** 1'27"

**SUMMARY:** When the disease is cured parents believe that the nightmare has finished. However, the treatments received by children with cancer have associated complications that cause physical and psychological sequels that must be treated by specialist before children go back to their normal lives. The Spanish Association for the Effects of Cancer Treatment was created in Seville to fulfil this task and guarantee that these children receive the assistance they need to be able to fully integrate into society.

Alejandro likes soccer, paddle and skateboarding. When he was 10 years old, a tumour changed his life and the lives of his family. It was successfully removed, but the complications associated with it are delaying his full recovery.

Just a few years ago, only 20 % of the diagnosed children overcame cancer, but now this figure has risen to 80%. The Spanish Association for the Effects of Cancer Treatment helps these survivors to go back to normal.
