



## **Greta's Dream, a tale that explains children the importance of organ donation**

**SUMMARY:** The Reina Sofía Hospital of Cordova has edited a tale to explain and raise awareness about the importance of organ donation among children. 'Greta's Dream' is the title of a book that tells the story of how, thanks to organ donation, a girl's dream comes true when she grows up. This tale allows minors to become familiar with organ donation and transplants, so they can understand their importance from an early age. In addition, thanks to the support of the Atresmedia Foundation, this story has been turned into an animation movie that is going to be watched by hospitalised children in Spain.

### **VTR:**

Greta is five and wants to go to the Moon. As an adult, she becomes the first woman to set foot on this satellite. A dream come true thanks to her determination but, most importantly, to the liver transplant she received when she was little. 'Greta's Dream' is a tale, edited by the Reina Sofía Hospital of Cordova, which aims to raise awareness about organ donation among children.
