



The mothers of newborn babies have their questions answered thanks to this project

LOCATION: Seville

LENGTH: 1'39"

SUMMARY: In a calm, intimate space, the mothers who have just given birth in the Virgen del Rocío Hospital in Seville have their questions answered with the help of the midwives at the health centre. They are given information to counteract the myths and false beliefs surrounding breastfeeding and care of the baby during its first weeks of life. Around one hundred mothers come each month to this postnatal classroom, the first of its kind within the Andalusian health system.

VTR:

This is Ana and Leo. They arrived in the world just two days ago. And there are their mothers.

BACKGROUND Stomach against stomach, so that the baby doesn't have to turn its head to latch onto your breast.

As they wait to be discharged, the mothers raise their questions and worries with the midwives, about breastfeeding for example. They learn that this can be a good position for feeding the baby.

"In the first 24 hours, when she starts breastfeeding, the mother is faced with discomfort that she won't have after a week. And this is where she is hit with many doubts and fears."
