

Biosolarization: a new agricultural technique to avoid chemicals in strawberry cultivations

LOCATION: Moguer (Huelva)

DURATION: 1'30"

SUMMARY: It is an innovative and ecologic technique. The Institute for Agricultural and Fisheries Research and Training in Andalusia has tested it in strawberry fields in Huelva. Biosolarization permits disinfecting soil using natural manure, water and a plastic that covers the ground hermetically for four weeks. Gasses emitted by mature and high temperatures erase fungi and weed, as manure enriches the ground.

In this experimental farm is developed an innovative and ecologic cultivation technique, especially useful for strawberries. These workers of the Institute for Agricultural and Fisheries Research and Training in Andalusia use the sun's heat and their natural manure to disinfect the ground in a natural way, with no chemicals.

"Here we aren't just speaking about a ground bio-disinfection technique, we are also increasing soil life."

The manure they use is son fresh that is still decomposing. This one comes from the hens of the area. They water so the ground is wet and then cover it with this plastic. It will remain sealed for a month. During its decomposition, manure emits gasses that erase fungi and weeds; and also...

"On the other side we rise the temperature of the soil predisposing those pathogens to become more susceptible to be attacked."

Manure's gases, the heat and the lack of oxygen disinfect the ground and enrich it. But, can biosolarization be applied to all cultivations?
