



Teranga GO: an app that connects migrants to share a trip to their roots

LOCATION: Granada

DURATION: 1'35''

SUMMARY: Granada has been the place where a new app that eases the mobility of migrants between their places of origin and where they live has been created. It is a project started by a Spaniard, Gustavo, and a Senegalese citizen, Augustin. The idea was to create a platform so people could share their cars and the expenses generated by traveling from European to African countries. They have started by travels between Spain and Senegal.

VTR:

'Teranga' means 'hospitality' in Senegal, the country where Augustin was born. He is well aware of the obstacles found by his community when they need to travel, and explained them to Gustavo. Together, they have created Teranga Go, an app to ease the mobility of migrants between Europe and Africa, as well as parcel shipments.

The first route offered by this app is the one between Senegal and Spain. There are around 60.000 Senegalese people in Spain. Due to the high expenses, most of these trip are made by car so, why not sharing them?

They have started a crowd-funding campaign to cover the maintenance expenses of this app.
