



## **Igrupetto: virtual routes to increase the fun in riding a stationary bicycle**

**LOCATION:** Dos Hermanas (Sevilla)

**DURATION:** 1:40

**SUMMARY:** It is an audiovisual platform created by Salvador Romero, an engineer from Dos Hermanas who loves cycling and intends to increase the fun in trainings with stationary bikes or rollers. He offers users virtual routes, for example, around the Pyrenees, The Alps or Andalusian landscapes, such as the white villages of Cádiz. This platform also offers cultural and tourist information about the places that the cyclist virtually visits. Salvador is already thinking about expanding this idea to treadmill running.

Salvador is an engineer who loves cycling. One day he thought about how boring could pedalling in a stationary bike be, as the only landscape that you can admire are four walls. That's why he created Igrupetto.
