SUMMARY: La Ciudad Accesible, headquartered in Granada, is a non-profit project that works in support of universal accessibility. They were awarded the 2015 European Citizens Prize by the European Chamber in the category of Inclusion. This project is leading numerous protests and has also carried out more than 7,500 free legal advice consultations.

Antonio has had a disability since birth, but it wasn't until some time later, as a result of a sickness, that he discovered a need for better accessibility in his society. He is one of the driving forces in La Ciudad Accesible, fighting for accessibility in order to allow more social inclusion.
