

Inclusive tourist routes with young people with Down syndrome as guides

SUMMARY: The association Granadown has designed free tourist visits for the Grenadian suburb El Realejo in which young people with Down syndrome are the guides. It's called 'Free Tour,' free visits aiming to strengthen the capabilities of these young people and promote their independence and self-esteem.

BACKGROUND

"It was founded in 1701. It was created to teach poor children."

Yolanda is one of the young people taking part in the 'Free Tour' in Granada, a project from the Granadown Association in which Grenadians with Down syndrome become tourist guides to show visitors the corners of the Realejo suburb.
