



A comic book pays tribute to Bernardo de Gálvez, who had a key role in the American Independence

LOCATION: Torre del Mar (Málaga)

SUMMARY: Juan de Aragón is a young illustrator who has been in charge of creating a comic book about another Malagan, Bernardo de Gálvez. This comic book has been part of an exhibition in La Casa de América of Madrid about this Spanish serviceman, who was made an honorary citizen by the United States Government for his role in the American War of Independence.

A Malagan of the 21st century drawing another Malagan of the 18th century. Juan de Aragón was chosen to create a comic book based on the life of Bernardo de Gálvez to include it in an exhibition about him in La Casa de América of Madrid.
