

Health Challenge Andalusia: a challenge to include society in facing COPD

LOCATION: Seville

DURATION: 1'39"

SUMMARY: Health Challenge Andalusia is an Andalusian Government initiative aiming to use society's talent to search for solutions to common problems. In their first meeting, the councils of Health and Employment from the Andalusian government, in collaboration with Vodafone, Sandetel and the Andalusian Agency for Health Quality,, have taken up the challenge of developing a mobile app to improve the adherence of the treatment of people with COPD, an illness that limits the lung capacity of those that suffer from it and which affects 10% of over 65s. Anyone who manages to complete the challenge will get a reward: 30.000 euros in cash, piloting the app in the real world. But what's most important is to improve COPD sufferer's quality of life.
