

## **'Call me Paula,' the first Spanish children's novel with a transsexual child as its protagonist**

**SUMMARY:** 'Call me Paula' is the first child's novel in Spain that has a transsexual girl as its protagonist. It's also the author Concepción Rodríguez's first work, who, touched by the news regarding cases of discrimination in educational centres towards 'trans' boys and girls, decided to write the novel to promote respect towards human diversity.

The day her mother died, she stopped calling herself Pablo. The pain meant she could no longer lie to the world about her identity. That is how 'Call me Paula' starts, the first child's novel in Spain with a transsexual girl as its protagonist. The Sevillian Concepcion Rodriguez is the author.
