

## A solidarity park to listen to children's laughter in an Almerian neighbourhood

**LOCATION:** Almería

**DURATION:** 1'43"

**SUMMARY:** El Puche neighbourhood, in Almería, is one of the most depressed areas in the city. Three thousand children live in it, but there's no park where they can go in the area. La Alcazaba Primary School, its parent's association, associations and neighbours are solving this problem by building a park for children. They count of the support of dozens of people and 200 old tyres that are becoming part of the urban furniture.

These are very special builders. They are the neighbours of El Puche, one of the most depressed areas in Almería, and they are determined to change their reality. They decided to begin by building a park for those who are the future of the neighbourhood: the children.
