SUMMARY: Swimming to promote integration. Juan José Polo, from Seville, studies Physical Education and loves swimming. He wanted people with and without disabilities to train together, so they could compete in the same level. That's how the Al-Andalus Sevilla Sports Club was created in 2015. Its members have already won several medals. There're no barriers for this club that has opened its doors to integration.

VTR:

In the beginning of 2015 a young Sevillian had an idea: why not making swimmers with and without disabilities compete among each other in the same place? Juan José, also known as Polo, was certain: despite they were people of different ages, if they had the same competitive level, they could do it.

"The idea is to bring together people with and without disabilities. That's the goal of my project, creating a club where there's full integration, where people with disabilities have a place, because currently there is only a few."

The idea was based on his own experience in the pool. Polo studied Physical Education, he was a swimming coach and worked with people with disabilities. When he had to make his end-of-degree project, he decided to establish the theoretical basis for a sports club that, put into practice, has already begun to win medals.
